



FINDING FAITH: Small Group Bible Study inspired the movie by "Missed Opportunities"

INTRODUCTION

Gary Robinson is a man haunted by regret and estranged from his own daughter, living with the weight of chances he let slip by. After an angelic dream stirs something in him, Gary is prompted to buy a struggling youth camp, determined to answer God's call on his life. Through a moving series of interconnected stories, Gary sets out to make sure no one else misses the chance he almost let pass him by: the chance to know Jesus. The film is an encouraging reminder that God is always at work, placing divine appointments in front of us and inviting us to say yes to Him, no matter how many chances we've missed before.



DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. THE WEIGHT OF REGRET

- Gary carries deep regret over past choices and a broken relationship with his daughter. How does the film portray regret as something God can still redeem, rather than something that disqualifies a person from His purposes?
- Read Joel 2:25-26 and Philippians 3:13-14. How do these passages speak to God's ability to restore what has been lost and to press forward rather than remain trapped by the past? What does it look like to receive God's redemption of "the years the locusts have eaten"?



2. RESPONDING TO GOD'S CALL

- Gary's angelic dream becomes a turning point, compelling him to act decisively rather than delay. How does the film's title and Gary's obedience underscore the biblical urgency of responding to God when He calls?
- Read Hebrews 3:15 and 2 Corinthians 6:2. How do these passages emphasize that God's call comes with a sense of "today," not "someday"? Are there any areas of your life where you need to respond to God today?



DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

3. DIVINE APPOINTMENTS



- Through the youth camp, Gary encounters a range of people, each representing someone who might otherwise miss their opportunity to hear the gospel. How does this structure of interconnected stories reflect the truth that God places specific people in our paths for His purposes?

- Read Acts 8:26-31 and Colossians 4:5-6. How do these passages show believers being led to specific individuals at specific moments, and being called to make the most of every opportunity? Who might God be placing in your path at the moment?

4. REDEMPTION AND PURPOSE IN SUFFERING

- As Gary pursues God's call, his relationship with his estranged daughter is also part of the story's arc toward restoration. How does the film link a renewed relationship with God to the pursuit of reconciliation in broken human relationships?

- Read 2 Corinthians 5:18-19 and Malachi 4:6. How do these passages connect the ministry of reconciliation given to believers with God's desire to turn hearts back toward one another? Are there any relationships where God is calling you to pursue reconciliation?



REFLECTION & APPLICATION

Where in your life have you let a window of opportunity, whether to share your faith, reconcile a relationship, or obey a clear call from God, close without acting?

Consider one specific person God may be placing in your path at the moment, and what it would look like to not let that moment pass you by.



PRAYER

Close the Bible study with a time of prayer, inviting participants to bring before God any regret over missed chances, whether in relationships, obedience, or sharing their faith.

Pray for boldness to respond to God's call today rather than delaying, and for eyes to recognize the people He places in their path. Pray also for the restoration of estranged relationships, that God would turn hearts back toward one another.



CONCLUSION

Like Gary, none of us are beyond the reach of God's redemption, even after years of regret or delay. The Bible calls us to respond to God's voice today and to trust Him to restore what feels broken. Encourage each other to walk forward in obedience rather than delay, and to seize the opportunities God gives to share His love and pursue reconciliation.
